Student Enrollment Trends

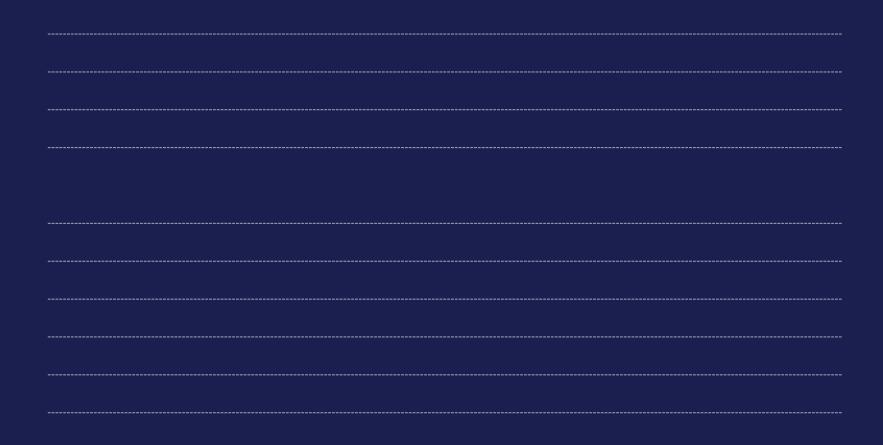


Average Membership Trend

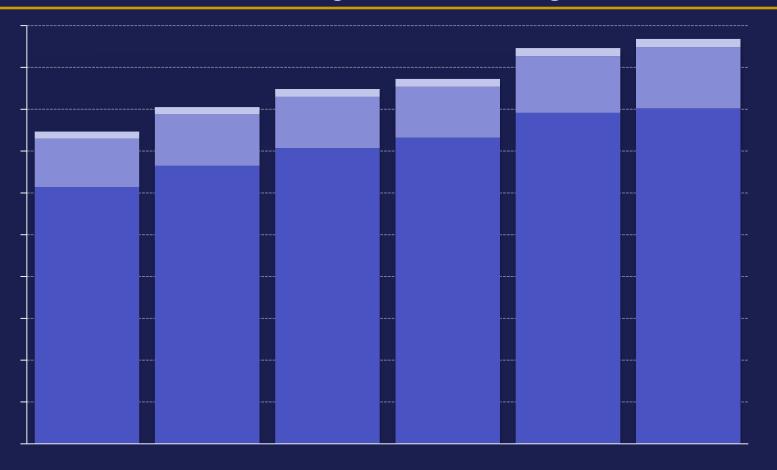
