

Parent/Guardian Guide to the Individual Student Report, Grades K-12 v-1

What is the Individual Student Report?

The Individual Student Report shows your child's scores on the ACCESS for ELLs assessment. This report is for families and educators.

The top of the report includes your child's name, date of birth, grade level, test tier, school and district name, state, and the district and state identification numbers.

What does the Individual Student Report tell me?

The report shows the eight scores your child could receive on the test. If your child took all four sections of the test, he/she will receive all eight scores, or not available.

What should I look for in my child's report?

We encourage families to look at all of the scores reported for their child. Here are some suggestions on how to interpret, or make sense of, your child's scores

- x Look at the Language Domain scores. Look at her Proficiency Level scores for Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. Which scores are closer to 6.0? Which scores are closer to 1.0?
- x Look at the Composite Score. Look at his/her Proficiency Level scores for Oral Language, Literacy, Comprehension, and the Overall Score.
